

High-flying McKinleys

down Garfield Road, tossing candy to the crowd and casting their minds back to the childhood they spent in Fraser.

The McKinley family, descendants of Fraser's second mayor, returned to their hometown July 25, 2010 to march as grand marshals in the city parade.

All 10 surviving children of Otis "Doc" and Phyllis McKinley wore the same blue T-shirt in the parade, but then, they got used to matching clothes ages ago. Their mother often dressed them in matching plaid shirts as they capered around on the runways at McKinley Airport in the 1960s. Their parents ran the first privately owned airport in Michigan, a Cessna dealership and a flight school in Fraser. That proved to be convenient. With 11 kids in the family, one now deceased, transportation was always a challenge, especially for a family that loved to travel. They used the family's airplane for travel, going four or Janice 'Richards' Potts, Aug. 16, 2009 five at a time up to their farm in Romeo.

"My dad really championed aviation," said a teary-eyed Gwen Francis, class of 1971, one of the McKinley daughters. "He was all about flying."

All of the boys in the family flew solo for their first time on their 16th birthdays. It's a memory the oldest son. Otis McKinley. will always cherish.

"My family life was so central to McKinley Airport — gassing up planes, checking the hangar doors when a storm was coming in," he remembers. The airport closed in the mid-'80s.

The kids were cheap labor for the McKinleys, and not just at the airport. They worked on the family farm, and the girls all worked at their father's dental office.

Their parents made quite an impression on the family, too. All of them fly planes, and every son became a dentist after seeing how happy the profession made their father.

Otis and Phyllis McKinley have passed on and the family has scattered across Michigan and the country, but their kids, 38 grandkids and six great-grandkids came (Cont'd on page 7)

back to Fraser July 21 for the city's parade. The family was invited by the Fraser First Booster Club in tribute of the boundless playground that will be built at McKinley Park.

"It was such a meaningful moment for me," said Ray McKinley. "As soon as I mentioned it to my family, they all bought their plane tickets from all over the country to come here and do this for mom and dad. I think mom and dad would be very proud today; not just of their family, but of Fraser."

While in town they drove the old familiar roads and walked through their old schools, at times becoming overwhelmed with emotions as they remembered their youth.

"When we were walking in the parade, people were saying, 'Welcome home,'" said Otis McKinley. "This is Fraser; it is home to the McKinleys."

After the parade, the whole clan met for a luncheon at the Fraser Activity Center, just a few blocks from where their home once stood on 15 Mile Road.

"It was just great to have all of them show up like that and support what we are doing," said Parks and Recreation Commissioner Lynn Evans, and said the commission is moving ahead with plans for the boundless playground and will soon be seeking grants to fund it.

MARK GARALCZYK '82 - Etched in History

By Brandon Moulding, Contributing Reporter The names that have been put into the Western Michigan Hall of Fame are the best of the best. Players that show outstanding skill in the sports they play. They have broken records, won awards, and developed a passion for a sport that they worked their hardest to become the best they could be. Among those names is one who once walked the halls of Fraser High School, in the very steps we take everyday.

Mark Garalczyk attended Fraser High School from '79-'82. He played football under the coaching staff of Ross MacDonald, Will Barns and Al Kastl. His team was the only team in Fraser history to make it to playoffs. He played as a defensive tackle until senior year, when he played tackle offensively as well.

"Once he realized he wanted to become a great football player, he realized he needed to become a great student," Barns said. His rise to fame did not come without work. His grades suffered in his early high school career. His classes did not allow him to qualify for college.

"With help from his counselor, we started making changes in his schedule. With hard work, he was able to meet all the requirements for college acceptance," MacDonald said.

Nobody could fully predict how successful he was going to be.


"We mistook him for what he really was; he had a desire to excel," Kastl said.

He did just that. While at Western, he ranked first in tackles with 302 tackles. He was the first Team All-MSC as a Junior in 1985, Defensive Player of the Year is 1986. Garalczyk won many other awards while at Western.

After College, Garalczyk went on to play pro football for the Cardinals, Jets and Oilers. In 1991, his pro career was abruptly ended due to a neck injury. All in all though, Garalczyk paved his way to success through hard work and dedication.

"It's the desire to do things and having goals and people to help achieve those goals," Kastl said. That's just it; Garalczyk set goals, and then listened to his coaches' advice to improve himself. He utilized the resources he was given and did something with it. For that, he has been accepted among the great.
