

Michigan's Outstanding Mom Award

There was no doubt what Mary Tocco wanted to do with her life. "My No. 1 goal was to be a mom," said the former Mount Clemens resident. (1974 FHS graduate as Kosloskey)

She got her wish. Tocco, who now lives in Bellaire, (MI) is the mother of five grown children and grandmother to five. Her dedication to motherhood will get national attention when she competes (in July, 2013) for the America's Outstanding Mom Award. Tocco will represent Michigan in the competition that takes place July 25-28 in New York. Contestants, who are nominated by their children and/or family members, comprises women who have been "exemplary role models in the communities and in their families." Tocco was nominated by her daughter Renee.

Tocco, one of 11 children, learned from her mother Viola Kosloskey. "It was not an easy life," said Tocco of growing up in a farmhouse on Moravian. "Faith was my mother's greatest gift to me. She knelt down and prayed with us every night. You choose to be happy and seek peace through God." Tocco in turn passed this belief, faith and trust to her children: Renee Hunter, D.C., Austin Tocco, Dr. Lia Miller, D.C., Curtis Tocco and Preston Tocco.

"You lead by example," said Tocco. "You're the biggest influence. We make a huge impact and you need to take motherhood seriously. When you have kids, it's no longer just about you."

Tocco home schooled four of her five children, and split her time between raising her family and working in her husband's office.

"But the kids always came first," she said. Tocco and her husband divorced 11 years ago, and she calls it "the hardest thing I ever went through." But she

said her children "did okay" and she believes it helped that "they saw I could get through this."

Tocco also is known for her work as a public speaker, natural health care advocate and host of "Healing Our World" radio program airing 4-5 p.m. Saturdays on Republic Broadcasting Network of Round Rock, Texas. She is "passionate about children's health issues," specifically autism.

With a platform "Heart for Autism," her goal is to "raise awareness about the autism crisis currently affecting 15,000 children in Michigan."

"There will be 80,000 (children with autism) in the next five years if we don't stop this trend," said Tocco, who sees a direct relationship between autism and "toxins in the world" and what components are in childhood vaccines.

Tocco has been researching autism for more than 10 years, attending conferences, presenting programs herself, and working with physicians to help improve the "health and welfare of these special children."

Just as she set a goal of becoming a mother, she has now set her sights on reaching "thousands of people this year as she travels to fundraisers and events around Michigan."

But her projects have taken a personal financial toll, and Tocco hopes that maybe by participating in — and hopefully winning — the America's Outstanding Mom Award, she'll be able to reach more people "with my message on autism."

in the smoker is started around 8 p.m. The pig will smoke all night and should be done about 11 a.m. the next morning iust before the picnic begins. through the night, John rechecks the



foil, vents and charcoal and temperature every 2 hours (at least) & then decides

whether more fuel is needed. He maintains a temperature of 300 degrees for the whole night.

Over the years, John has learned what it takes to keep the temperature up and even. During the night, he adjusts the opening and/or closing of the vents and determines whether or not to cover the

smoker with blankets (not the wool ones) the kind welders use that



are made of fiberglass and rated to 1000 degrees Fahrenheit.

After graduation, John worked as a Toolmaker Apprentice at Lamb Technician, now known as MAG Powertrain. Throughout the years he held many positions and just recently has become the Sales Account Executive after being the Area Manager for the past 20 years. His work experience has taken him to many foreign countries. John says, "I've had a very successful career, thanks to all the Fraser High School teachers and faculty."

John has three children and a wife who is presently fighting breast cancer for the last 22 years. He has a message for all women, "You must use flax seed

daily!!" Some of his other interests included being a volunteer firefighter for many years in Goodland Township and roasting numerous pigs for Relay for Life, firefighter golf outings, etc.

When asked why he does this every year, John replied "My family and I have had a good life and we want to give back."



AMAZING JOHNATHAN says goodbye to the stage

After a 30-year show business career and more success than he imagined, the Amazing Johnathan is calling it quits.

The 55-year-old Fraser native and Las Vegas icon is retiring for health reasons. He (has made) his final Detroit-area appearance Thursday, Feb. 20 through Feb. 22, 2014 at Mark Ridley's Comedy Castle in Royal Oak.

"It's time to hang it up," John Szeles, his real name, said in a telephone interview.

Amazing Johnathan was diagnosed in 2007 with cardiomyopathy, a heart condition, and likely will have to have a pacemaker placed in his chest. He is hooked up to a portable defibrillator.

His condition has deteriorated to the point that he uses a wheelchair to get through airports, but assures that he has enough left in the tank for some good shows. His schedule is limited to

weekend performances for the next few months before he leaves the stage

"I had this heart thing beat six years ago, and then I got cocky and stopped taking my medications, so my heart is basically failing," he said. "But I've got it made — I've saved enough money so I don't have to work. If I went tomorrow, I know I've had a good run."

Johnathan got his start performing at places such as the former Chaplin's Comedy Club in Clinton Township before moving out to San Francisco. His act is a mix of stand-up comedy and magic, along with gross-out tricks such as hanging eyeballs and "cutting" his wrists.

In the past three decades, the eccentric comic - magician has appeared on hundreds of television shows, authored a how-to book of practical jokes and picked up fans and friends around the world including illusionist Criss Angel.

In recent years, he's become a full-time headliner in Las Vegas. Now

residing in Marina Del Ray, Calif., he has a podcast and still writes material for other entertainers.

He plans to downsize his life, which means he'll be less involved with two longtime passions — his classic car collection and an indoor drive-in movie theater built in a Vegas warehouse that was based on the former Gratiot Drive-In in Roseville. It includes murals reproducing the outer fence line, car speaker poles and even a Macomb Mall sign.

Johnathan says he will miss the industry, but tells fans not to feel sorry for him.

"I feel fine," he said. "This isn't slowing the pace of my show at all."


