Our Deserving 2016 Scholarship Recipients

The Fraser High School 25+ Alumni Club is proud to recognize our 2016 scholarship recipients. Each student profiled below received \$2,000 from the Club to help with the cost of continuing their education.

The Audrey Kleino-DeFauw Memorial / FHS 25+ Alumni Club Scholarship Fund has now awarded \$44,400 in financial assistance to FHS seniors as they've graduated, thanks to the continued support of FHS 25+ alumni like you! The information in these profiles was written in March, 2016 as part of the application process.

Nicholas Sharpe, the son of Douglas, Class of 1983, and Julie (Verkeyn), Class of 1984, plans to attend Michigan State University to study Business. He's completed numerous accelerated and Advanced Placement (AP)



classes at FHS, including an English class every semester. He was an honor roll student all 4 years; as a varsity soccer player Nicholas was recognized as the team's MVP in his senior

season and twice named an All-County player, helping lead the Ramblers to one regional and two district championships. While out of the classroom, Nicholas served his community by volunteering with St. Ronald's, the Fraser Goodfellows, St. Vincent DePaul, Soccer Special Olympics, Walk for Chiari, and Eastside Soccer Camp. He also was a member of Fraser 4As (Academics, Activities, Arts, Athletics).

His recommendation letters note that he always fully accepted responsibility and was very highly involved in his classes and activities. In the classroom, Nicholas stood out because of strong leadership skills, hard work, dedication, willingness to assist his classmates and his high quality work. His teachers described a student that was goal-oriented and focused on his future.

JASON HARTLESS, Class of 1986

I first became aware of Jason Hartless after watching a video of him participating at a Ronnie Montrose tribute concert. His high intensity performance of "Free Ride" caught my attention and his infectious energy was impossible to miss. A little research led me to a series of online videos capturing his day job as a member of Ted Nugent's rhythm section. The first thing I

noticed was the balance that Hartless had between pocket playing and chops. It is obvious that the Nugent gig calls for both. "The Motor City Madman" as some call him enhances his classic songs with long guitar solos. This requires his backing band to constantly adjust to wherever their fearless leader goes. It is essential that the drummer sync with the singer in order to propel the rest of the band. Hartless excels at this. More than a drummer he has an impressive resume projects including studying Music Business at Berklee College of Music, acting as a managing partner of a record label and instructing students as a music teacher. Tristan's studies at FHS included the accelerated English, Spanish, Chemistry, and Physics classes along with AP Biology, AP Chemistry, and AP Psychology. He was involved in many activities during high school including Peer to Peer as an anchor, Family, Career and Community Leaders of America (FCCLA), Fraser 4A's, and Teens Talking Truth.

some time out to discuss his drum-
ming and much more.

MA: Did your schools have music
programs?

JH: I was very fortunate that I
went to a public school that was in
Fraser, MI which is a little four
square mile town outside of De-
troit. Despite its size Fraser has
been recognized by the NAMM
Association as having one of the
top music departments in the coun-
try. I was incredibly lucky to have
grown up there. I had a very deep
public school education when it
came to music. I was in jazz band,
concert band, symphony band,
marching band, drum line, percus-
sion ensemble and I also played
drums for the show choir from
time to time. When they were per-
forming in competitions around the
country they would take me along.
I was mostly self-taught although I
had casually studied with various
guys like Corky Laing and Tommy
Clufetos who plays with Black
Sabbath and also drummed with

Alice Cooper and Ted Nugent.
(Small world).

I had never had formal private one-
on-one lessons until about Middle
School and High School. I started
seriously studying with a guy
named George Dunn, a strict jazz
player who was regimented and he
"super-whipped" my ass into shape.
He taught me about reading music
and playing all of these different
styles. He taught me self-discipline.
There is a big difference between
being a rock drummer and playing
in a symphony where you count two-
hundred measures before hitting a
triangle. My knowledge and maturi-
ty in regards to drumming came
along the more I studied. I wouldn't
have the skills I have today without
any of those teachers. Music was
valued where I was from . . .

With high voter turnout, all incumbents on the ballot were ousted in the May 7, 2016 city council and mayoral election. Votes are unofficial until canvassed and certified at the May 17 city council meeting. In the mayoral race, Diane Piwko-Scott, Class of 1979, was declared the winner against incumbent Mayor Joe Helmberger.

“I am thrilled and appreciative that the citizens of Farmersville supported me in believing we should have a say in council decisions, and that all business should be conducted in an open environment that provides the same information to residents that council members have access to. Please find it in your hearts to give us just an hour or two of your time. For those who volunteer every year, we are very grateful for your commitment. It can't be done without you!

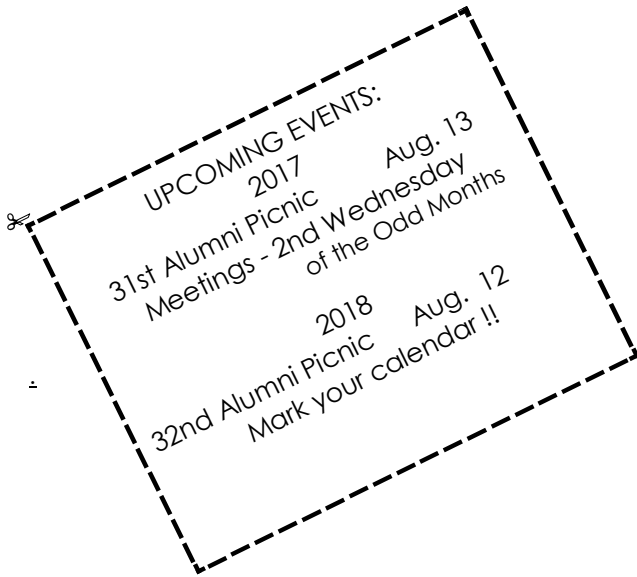
